### 2022- 2023 IN REVIEW: Report of the President and Chief Executive Officer

When reflecting back over the last 12 months, we are very proud of the work we have accomplished. There have been many successes and celebrations as a team, and with our children, families and community partners. As we navigated through the Pandemic and virtual services over the last couple of years, it was great to return to more in-person services and hearing the chatter and laughter in our centres.

Our commitment to the vision, mission and values of the organization continues to be our foundation in everything we do. Our dedication to family centered care, strength-based services and service excellence is at the centre of all we do and allows us to provide quality and safe services to our children and families.

THRIVE experienced significant growth through programs / services, teams and office space. New programs include the Infant Child Development Program, Preschool Speech and Language, SmartStart Hubs, and Entry to School through the Ontario Autism Program. Our teams grew along with our new services, and we welcomed a new Intake team, an Infant & Child Development team, an IT Systems Administrator and a People and Culture department. With the expansion in service offerings, we also increased our Health Records and Administrative teams, leadership positions and created a Kinesiologist position. We expanded our Queen space location and opened a new site in Hornepayne.

We developed our Strategic Plan for 2022 - 2025 that will help guide our work over the next three years. Our strategic plan is driven by our **strategic directions**, which provide clear focus and direction while still allowing us to respond and adapt as circumstances evolve over the coming years. The strategic directions include:

- Enhancing Awareness and Collaboration
- Ensuring a Quality Client Experience
- Investing in Culture and People
- Strengthening our Systems and Infrastructure

Our focus over this last year has been on strengthening interdisciplinary collaboration, connection and awareness across our organization and community partners. We have worked on defining pathways and services to ensure families feel supported, engaged, empowered and have a sense of belonging. Recruitment and retention of our talented staff has been an important part of our work.

THRIVE Child Development Centre has a highly engaged, developed and dedicated Board of Directors who are committed to providing excellent governance and support. We are committed to enhancing and continuing to build on a strong and diverse governance structure. THRIVE's staff, Board of Directors and its Foundation are committed to providing services that will meet the individual needs of children with diverse abilities to support them in achieving their own personal extraordinary. We continue to strive for an inclusive community of belonging, enhanced collaboration with our community partners and ensuring an exceptional service experience for children and families.

The agency has much to celebrate, what follows are highlights from THRIVE's program, service activities and provincial initiatives







#### **Programs and Services Highlights**

#### Community Based/School Based Rehabilitation Services

#### Preschool Speech and Language program

THRIVE was thrilled to become the lead agency for the Preschool Speech and Language Program in May 2022. The Preschool Speech and Language program supports children with communication difficulties. This includes preschool children 0-4 years of age with speech-language delays or complex communication needs. The program focuses on prevention, early identification, and intervention, with a strong emphasis on parent education and training.



A handout was developed to help caregivers clearly understand the process from intake to discharge including initial intake, assessment, determination of goals, service options and frequency and transition to school-based services. This is now shared widely with caregivers.


#### Autism Spectrum Disorder Education Series

We developed a series that consists of four virtual parent education sessions for families of children with a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder. The series was developed by a Speech-Language Pathologist who is undergoing training in Relationship Development Intervention, a relationship based, developmental model of intervention for children with Autism. Content includes sessions to support parents post diagnosis as well as 3 sessions that provide families with strategies and suggestions to support their child's unique learning style. It is done in a group format and offered virtually to ensure the content is accessible to all families. Families may be presently involved with THRIVE services or on the waitlist to access this service.

#### Partnering for Change - P4C

Over the 2022/2023 school year the School Based Rehabilitation Services- Occupational Therapy (SBRS - OT) team has been working toward implementing the Partnering for Change (P4C) service delivery model in schools. P4C is an evidence-based program that was developed in collaboration with McMaster University, CanChild and the LHIN and is currently being implemented by Empowered Kids Ontario SBRS OT services across the province. Some of the highlights over the year.

- The SBRS OT team has taken the online P4C education that was developed by CanChild.
- The P4C model has been presented to the Special Education departments of the Algoma District School Board and Huron Superior District Catholic School Board.
- The SBRS OT team has collaborated with and selected schools from the Algoma District School Board and Huron Superior Catholic District School Board who would be appropriate to pilot the P4C model.
- THRIVE has been selected by Empowered Kids Ontario, McMaster and Can Child as one of 10 research participants that are collecting data to confirm if varying P4C service delivery can yield the same results. Specifically THRIVE's participation in the research project will measure how effective this model is when delivered in a remote, Francophone community.
- THRIVE has representation that sits on the EKO Tiered Intervention Community of Practice and has facilitated linking this community of practice group and the CanChild/McMaster research mentoring group.



#### Physiotherapy / Kinesiology

This past year, THRIVE trialed a new Registered Kinesiologist position within it's Physiotherapy Department. Similar to Physiotherapy, Kinesiology is a regulated health profession, defined as the scientific study of human movement, performance and function. Registered Kinesiologists use evidence-based research to treat and prevent injury and disease, and to improve movement, performance and overall quality of life. Our Kinesiologist primarily works with pre-school and school-aged clients who present with a gross motor skill delay. They also are the lead for THRIVE's bike groups and clinics, work with the specialized classrooms within the Algoma District School Board and Huron Superior Catholic District School Board to support with ensuring all students are able to participate in physical activity, and provide support to our contracted physiotherapy services in the district. Our Kinesiologist works across a variety of settings including the Centre, daycares, schools, clients homes and community settings such as fitness centres and community pools, providing assessment and treatment to a variety of clients. After a successful one year trial period, the Registered Kinesiologist contract position has been made a permanent position within the THRIVE Physiotherapy Department.

#### Family Support Services

THRIVE launched the SmartStart Hub, a service intended for families who are unsure of where to start accessing services related to their child's developmental needs, or how to find out what services their child needs. SmartStart Hubs will connect families to assessments and services including speech and language pathology, occupational therapy, and physical therapy as well as mental health services, specialty clinics, and familybased supports like respite services and parent coaching available in our community. We were also thrilled to welcome the Infant Child Development Program (ICDP) to THRIVE.







This program is a home-based program that provides services to children from birth to school entry who have established developmental delay or are identified as at risk for delay.

Families are provided a variety of services based on the individual child and family's needs. ICDP has taken on numerous opportunities such as community engagement, offering a parent/ child coffee break jointly facilitating the PEERS program. Family Support Services went through a complete realignment, resulting in specialized team functions. Three intake positions were added to provide all intake functions and resulted in a streamlined and consistent approach to our intake screening and determination of eligibility. Social work functions have also been specialized to include dedicated social workers, Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder social workers and dedicated Service Planning Coordinators.

#### Early Learning Resources and H.S. McLellan Preschool

THRIVE's Early Learning Resource Consultants resumed in-person visits in September 2022. The licensed childcare programs across the district of Algoma missed the modelling and coaching from the ELR consultants, while in the programs with the children. In November 2022 the Resource Consultants were requested by the Algoma District Services Administration Board to provide a full day professional development to over two hundred Early Childhood Educators within the district of Algoma. The focus was on Self-Regulation. This professional development was so successful that a second full day session was requested in June 2023. The second session developed a connection between previous learning in Self-Regulation and a focus on building relationships with all caregivers and coworkers. The many discussions during this training focused on difficult conversations with families regarding diverse needs and supports, and how solution focused coaching can be utilized to involve all. Our Early Learning Resource Consultants have serviced 50 children in the City of Sault Ste. Marie and an additional 45 children in the Alaoma District.

H.S. McLellan Preschool welcomed families back into the building and worked hard to develop family connections. Parent boards, menu postings, curriculum webs and preschool home reading programs were all posted strategically for the parents to access when entering or leaving the building. Therapy services were welcomed back into the classrooms and it has been helpful that the necessary equipment, supplies and mentorship required to meet the diverse needs of the preschool and toddler program can be modelled in an inclusive environment.

A focus of the H.S McLellan Early Childhood Educators has been to create a natural outdoor learning and play space for all of the children. The H.S McLellan parents have been included in the playground vision and some donations of sanded wooden items have been provided. The educators recently volunteered time during a week-

end to stain picnic tables, plant gardens, and fill in and level all areas on the playground. A new fence will soon surround the preschool playground, allowing for more space for our children and new opportunities for learning. A strengthened connection with the District of Sault Ste. Marie Social Services Administration Board has provided opportunities for leadership with the role of Professional Practice Lead for two of our educators. Local leaders in Early Childhood Education are providing mentorship and training to build the capacity of our educators and this is positively impacting our program and outdoor vision.

#### Ontario Autism Program (OAP)

THRIVE provides Behavioural Support Services in Algoma. We began our development of services through our Fee for Service model that currently offers Applied Behavioural Analysis Services to children and families receiving funding through the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services; THRIVE continues to develop services for children, youth and families for the new needs-based Ontario Autism Program which will be provided over the next year.

We worked diligently with families as they gained understanding of this new needs-based OAP and the Ministry funded AccessOAP (an independent intake organization created to help families access autism services across the province) and we have added an OAP Family Support Coordinator to our team to further support our families through navigation of our services offered.

THRIVE has played an active role in the delivery of Foundational Family Services through the Northern Collaborative. Foundational Family Services aim to build capacity to support a child's learning and development. We are wrapping up our second year of the OAP Entry to School Program. The Entry to School program helps children develop schoolreadiness skills and provides transition supports as they enter kindergarten or Grade 1 for the first time.







#### 2022- 2023 THRIVE Child Development Centre Foundation Report

Over this past year, the Foundation's commitment of providing financial support to ensure children in Algoma can access services and reach their full potential has continued. THRIVE has experienced significant growth over the last few years and the Foundation's focus is to support the Centre's space and equipment needs, the Assistive Communication and Writing Aids Clinic, client electronic health records keeping system, the Family Assistance program, and enhanced programming needs for THRIVE families.

The Foundation has been the very appreciative and grateful recipient of donations from several generous donors including, Hydro One Inc. Employees' & Pension Charity Trust, Scottish Rite Charitable Foundation of Canada, Dr Lou & Mae Lukenda Charitable Foundation, Royal Trust Company, and Rotary Club of Sault Ste Marie. The Soo Mill Rotary Golf Tournament that was held at Crimson Ridge in August 2022, was outstanding with the great participants, prizes and a lot of fun and laughs. We also thoroughly enjoyed the outdoor Country Legends Tribute.

support for the programs and services that the Centre offers to children, youth and families. As the Centre continues to evolve and create new programs and services, the THRIVE Foundation will continue to plan appropriately to ensure financial support for the Centre.

Thank you again to the generous donors in our community who continue to support THRIVE Child Development Centre by their donations to THRIVE Foundation. Our collective work is truly amazing!






